He was assigned to Great Lakes Naval Base for the duration of World War II at the rank of 2nd Lieutenant. He played the goalie position for the Marquette University Hockey Team, from 1925 to 1931; he was captain for the 1930 to 1931 season, and they were National Collegiate Champions for the 1929 to 1930 season. William coached the Marquette University Freshman Hockey Team from 1931 to 1932. He played in the Neenah Recreational Softball League in the 1950s and 1960s. He was an avid fan of the Green Bay Packers and Neenah High School athletics. William was a member of the Chicago Dental Association, and the Winnebago County Dental Association. He served on the Neenah Park and Recreation Board and the Neenah Police and Fire Commission. He was past president of Neenah Kiwanis Club and the Neenah Quarterback Club. William was a life member of the Neenah-Menasha Elks Club and a 70 year member of the Neenah-Menasha Masons.
