

## Illness Fatal to G. A. Brautigam

Former Alderman
Played Professional
Baseball 20 Years

George A. "Dutch" Brautigam, 63, of 624 S. Telulah avenue, former alderman and active for many years in baseball circles, died shortly before 8:30 this morning after a 2-year illness.

Born April 10, 1885, in Chicago, Ill., Brautigam lived, since 1910 in Appleton. He managed the old Appleton Papermakers of the Wisconsin-Illinois league in 1912. For 20 years Brautigam played professional baseball. He recently had been employed by the Standard Manufacturing company.

Brautigam was alderman of the old Fourth ward in 1928 and 1929. After a lapse of two years he was reelected in 1932 and represented the Fourth ward until the wards were increased to 18 in 1940. He represented the Thirteenth ward, part of the old Fourth ward, until 1943.

Survivors are the widow; a son, George L., Jr., Kaukauna; a brother, Frank, Miami, Fla.; a sister, Mrs. George Gabelman, Chicago; and two grandchildren.

Friends may call at the Wichmann Funeral home from 7 o'clock tonight until the time of services. The rosary will be recited at 8 o'clock tonight and at the same hour Tuesday night. Services will be at 9 o'clock Wednesday morning at the funeral home and burial will be in St. Joseph cemetery.
