

RESIDENT 70 YEARS, CHARLES BOYCKS, DIES

Charles D. Boycks, 78, a native of Germany and a resident of Oshkosh for 70 years, died Wednesday evening at 11:50 o'clock at his home, 101 Grand avenue. Death was due to a lingering illness.

Born in Germany Oct. 20, 1867, Mr. Boycks came to the United States with his parents 70 years ago, coming directly to Oshkosh. His wife, Augusta, preceded him in death in this city July 8, 1912.

Mr. Boycks was a member of Oshkosh aerie No. 267, Fraternal Order of Eagles, the Woodmen of the World, and the Equitable Reserve association. He had been an employe of the Foster - Lotham Mills for 47 years.

Survivors include two sons, E. A. Boycks, Stevens Point, and Arthur Boycks, Oshkosh; three daughters, Mrs. W. J. Murphy, Stockton, Ill., Miss Minne Boycks, Oshkosh, and Mrs. Florian Lull, also of this city; 14 grandchildren; four great-grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews. One son, Walter, died in infancy.

Funeral services will be held Saturday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock at the Konrad funeral home, the Rev. Theodore Irion officiating. Interment will be at Riverside cemetery. Friends may call at the Konrad funeral home from Friday afternoon at 4 o'clock until the time of the services.
