

JOHN VAN RYZIN ENTERS LAST SLEEP

RESIDENT OF APPLETON MORE
THAN HALF CENTURY PASSES
AWAY EARLY TODAY

John Van Ryzin, a resident of Appleton for more than half a century, died this morning at 5:30 o'clock at his home at 1076 Third street, at the age of 54 years. Death was due to gangrene of the lungs. Mr. Van Ryzin was ill for five weeks.

The deceased was born in Appleton in 1857, and had lived here ever since excepting for a short sojourn in Batavia, Ill. He leaves a wife and nine children, seven sons: John of Leavenworth, Kansas; Paul, of Chicago; Roy, William, Walter, Clarence and Gerald, of this city; and two daughters, the Misses Marie and Helen, of this city. There are three grandchildren.

Two brothers of Mr. Van Ryzin, William and Martin, live in this city, and another brother, Albert lives in Auburn-dale, Wis. He leaves four sisters, Mrs. John Van Able, Pequaning, Mich; Mrs. L. Diebels, De Pere; Mrs. Frank Van Auker, Chicago; and Mrs. Anton Merline, Oconto.

Mr. Van Ryzin was a member of the Catholic Order of Foresters and the Catholic Knights of Wisconsin. He was for many years millwright at the Patten paper mill.

The funeral will be held from St. Mary's church, but no details have as yet been arranged.
